



AUTUMN NEWSLETTER October 2015

Trustees have recently returned from a monitoring trip to Kenya. The purpose of the trip was to check on the progress of the work being undertaken at the Spring of Life School in Kiandutu, Thika and to work with our TABS Kenya Trustees to plan for the next phase of development. We also took the opportunity to visit our friends in South Nyanza and visit the project in Rongo District.

We are delighted to report that the project in Kiandutu is making wonderful progress. All classrooms have now been completed thanks to the hard work of our volunteers on the trip in 2013 and our Kenyan partners. As a result we now have 262 children from the slum who are receiving education and a nutritious lunch every day they are at school. The school has developed a very positive reputation within the slum and has achieved credibility and support.

None of that would have been possible without donations, fundraising, support and prayers of all of you who contribute to TABS International, or without the dedication and selfless contribution being made by the project staff and trustees in Thika, who make many personal sacrifices to ensure the children benefit. We look forward to welcoming new children in January 2016 as the

new school year starts and the current Standard 5 children move to Standard 6.

INFORMATION:: There are 8 Standard Years in Kenyan schools. So, part of our planning meeting was to look at how we can develop a secondary school in the slum so children with academic potential can progress onto the next level of attainment once their primary education is completed.

NEXT STEPS

We have developed 3 phases of development going forward : 1.Immediate goals:

- To purchase an adjoining piece of land to create a playground for the children and to build 2 training workshops and enterprise buildings to offer training to young people who want to learn a trade rather than progress their education, as well as earn money for the project. We estimate the cost of this to be approx. £6,000
- To increase our financial contribution to the project from the current £1,200 per month to £2,000 to pay for additional staff, resources and food needed to achieve a full 8 Standard School.



 To acquire land to build a secondary school for the slum so that children can progress their education. Most of the teachers in the project live in Kiandutu, contributing to the local economy, supporting their community and setting examples of how aspirations can be achieved. A secondary school would really benefit the local community.

3. Long term goals:

 To develop a network of social enterprise that supports the work of a number of projects in Kenya. Our aim is to build sustainability so our partner projects become full determinants of their own futures.





PRAYER REQUESTS:

- Positive responses to our fundraising (more people are choosing to be Friends of Tabs through their fundraising efforts).
- The TABS Kenya Trustees and all the staff working in the project (for continued good working relationships and openness)
- The children in the slum including those who do not come to the project. Their lives are so hard. (Praise God for the School Chaplains outreach work within the slums supporting families)
- All who support our work and contribute their time and talents
