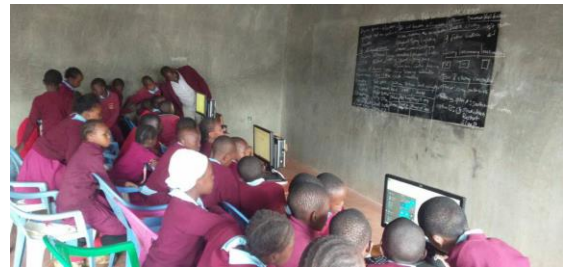
### Autumn Piano Soiree for TABS.
